You can follow these steps or do it your own way!

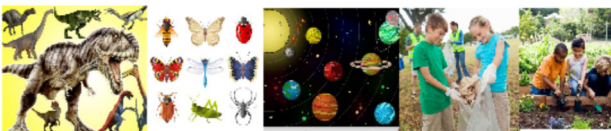
- Choose a Science related question or topic to investigate or explore.

1. Ask a question
2. Do some research
3. Make a prediction
4. Test your prediction



5. Analyse your results. Will your information or data be easier to use if you sort it out using a graph, a table, a labelled diagram or picture?
6. Explain your results any way you like! You may choose to make a model, a movie, a poster or a mixture of things to explain your project.

All participants will receive a certificate on completion and presentation of their project.

### Putting the fun into science at Deakin

Ever dreamt of building a killer virus? Or saving animals before they go extinct?

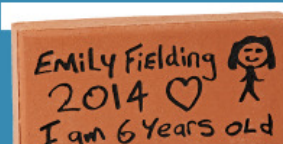
