Covid Update:

COVID updates

- Free rapid antigen tests will be made available for all staff and students in Victorian schools throughout Term 1 2022. It is recommended staff and students test 2 times per week.
- It is recommended Grade 3-6 students and primary school staff will continue to wear masks when indoors.
- Parents/carers should complete the Student COVID-19 COVID Test Portal if a student tests positive to COVID-19
 (via a PCR or rapid antigen test). Where a parent/carer informs the school by phone or written notification, the
 school must complete the Schools COVID Case 7 Management Tool.
- Students who report a positive result must isolate for seven days and not attend school during that period. 3. Where a student is a household contact of a positive case (that is, they have spent more than four hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house, accommodation, or care facility) they must inform the school and isolate for seven days and not attend school during that period
- Students must refrain from returning to school if they remain symptomatic, unless it is known that their symptoms are caused by an underlying health condition or medication.
- In Victorian government schools, parents, carers and other adult visitors who enter school buildings must be able to show evidence of two doses of COVID-19 vaccine or have a valid medical exception.

The following limited exceptions also apply:

- \cdot when attending to administer medical treatment to their own child when the treatment cannot be administered by the school
- · when attending to collect their child who is unwell and cannot leave the school building unaccompanied by their parent/carer
- · when attending for a momentary period that does not involve any sustained contact with staff or students



Eligibility

Students who meet one or more of the following criteria are eligible to attend a free holiday camp:

- attend a school that experienced closures of 5 days or more due to COVID-19 in 2021
- have an approved Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) application for 2022
- have a parent that holds a valid means-tested concession card (for example a Health Care Card, Job Seeker, Newstart Allowance, Disability Support Pension)
- · are in out of home care
- · have a disability
- · are from a refugee background
- · are Koorie students
- · are in the Navigator program.

The Department of Education and Training has worked directly with camp providers to secure spots on holiday programs for eligible families.

Cost

These camps are completely free of charge to eligible families. It will not cost you anything for your child to attend the camp.

Most camps can organise transport from central locations. Some camps may ask parents to provide transport for their child. After you choose a camp, the camp provider will send you information about transport.

Eligible Victorian students can attend a free holiday camp with the Positive Start program.

Positive Start holiday camps will run in the 2022 school holidays.

Holiday camps are a great way for your child to get outdoors, meet new friends and try new things. Holiday camps are generally organised by age range. Each day is full of active and fun things to do, such as archery, canoeing and ropes courses.

Whether a single overnight experience or spending several nights away, taking part in a school holiday camp program is a great way for your child to try new things, make new friends and enjoy active time in the great outdoors.

Camps offer clean and comfortable shared accommodation, a range of professionally led activities suitable for your child's age and experience and, of course, plenty of tasty and nutritious food.
