

Principal Report

This week, the grades 2-4 children headed off to Ballarat Wildlife Park on Monday. The children enjoyed viewing the many native Australian animals, including free-roaming Kangaroos, Koalas, Wombats, Tasmanian Devils, Eagles, Giant Tortoises, Crocodiles and Alligators, and a large display of Lizards and both venomous and non-venomous Snakes.

The grade three and four children participated in their camp, following the excursion. Our camp involved setting up a range of tents in the wind, with the help of the Koroit Scouts and Cubs. Tyna Lee has been an integral part of the planning, and we appreciate the effort made to provide our children with the opportunity to camp outside and due to the wind, camp inside the hall in tents. The children are to be commended for their persistence, dedication and adaptation during the evening.

Thank you to our staff. Camps are not possible without the ratio of staff. Thank you to Mrs Lathwell, Ms Higgins, Ms Bant, Ms Wooles and Mr Leggett for their support to make a camp possible. Thanks must also go to Richard McPherson and Les Lathwell for feeding the children on the night.

On Wednesday morning, we had our first Emergency drill for 2025. This was a lockdown drill for all. The children and teachers were very organised during this practice. Evacuation drills vary, and our next lockdown drill will be a fire in the hall which will require all staff and students to evacuate off-site (the football oval)

On Thursday morning, we held our Big Life Walk. F-3 children walked up to the gardens and walked the loop, while the 3-6 children walked the football oval. Big Life commenced ten years ago, working to support young people, families and school staff to build their skills and capacity to be resilient in the face of adversity and times of uncertainty. Utilising a tier one, strengths-based approach, Big Life has the vision of safeguarding young people against mental health challenges. Our Big Life walk raised \$110.65.

Thank you to all families and extended families for their contribution to the colour explosion. Firstly, it is a fantastic event that brings all families together. Secondly, it allows us to have specific fund-raising targets and finally it is a fabulous way to celebrate a successful term of learning.
