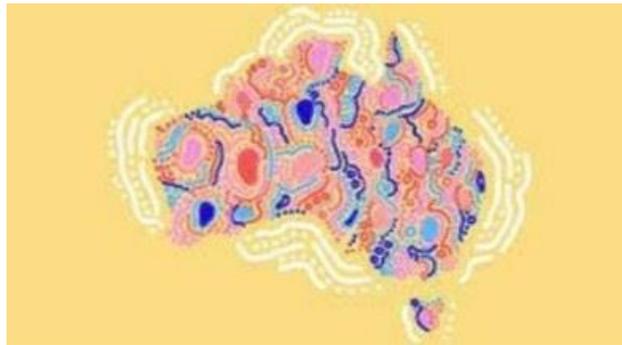

Principal Report

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, transition is important to us, and this year we have decided to align our transition visits with the Foundation transition visits. This will mean that all children will move into their respective classes for 2026 on 5 occasions in 2025. These will be in the afternoon from 2:15-3:15 on Wednesday, 12th, 19th, 26th November, and 3rd of December.

Tuesday, the 9th of December will be Orientation Day for all students from 9:00-1:30pm

The Transition process is a critical process, where teachers put a lot of work into combinations of children, learning styles and academic learning. The children have the opportunity to write down five friends that they would like to be with. Parents have also had the opportunity to provide feedback on friendship options. Please understand that each decision made is made in the interest of the child and we spend a large amount of time ensuring that each child has a selected person.

Grade 6 children will work with Dave, Amy and Mrs Mac. on a special Billy Cart Project. This is an exciting opportunity for the children, and if parents are available to support this project, please see Tanya, Dave or Mrs Cooper.

Students will be informed of their class on the **11th of November**. Please note that change is hard, and your child may take some time to adjust to the new classroom format. It is always important to remember that the children have many opportunities to join in learning community learning during inquiry (2 classes together) and multi age opportunities.

Open Communication

At Koroit and District Primary School, we value open and honest communication between home and school. Please know that our staff are always approachable, and no question is ever considered a silly one.

We have an incredible team at KDPS. Our staff are always willing to answer any wonderings. Mrs Cooper, Mrs Rivett, and I work closely together to ensure that every child is known, supported, and valued. Together, we strive to create a strong partnership with families so that every student can thrive.

Behaviour Matrix

Our Behaviour Matrix is a key part of the KDPS approach to supporting all students.

It was developed with input from our students and reflects the expectations of feeling safe, included, proud, and respectful. These expectations are regularly discussed and reinforced with children across all year levels (F–6).

Alongside this, our Behaviour Management Process outlines how we respond when expectations aren't being met. For example, if a child is not moving safely around the classroom, they may be asked to work in another classroom to reflect and be reminded of appropriate behaviour.

Leadership support is provided when a student becomes overwhelmed or dysregulated. In these situations, the student is given time and space to calm down in our sensory space — a quiet, supportive environment designed to help them regulate their emotions with the guidance and assistance of staff.

This consistent approach helps all students learn in a supportive and respectful environment.

BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT PROCESS

STEP 1: Move the student to another space within the classroom. If student refuses, move to **Step 4**.

STEP 2: If the student is not following expectations, remove to another classroom for a set amount of time (student's age + 2 minutes).

If student returns and makes positive choices:

If student refuses to leave or returns & continues to make poor choices:

STEP 3: Student to make up missed learning minutes.

STEP 4: Seek leadership support.

Jump Rope for Heart

We have now closed off fundraising for the Jump Rope for heart and completed the prize order. They will be delivered this term and distributed to all recipients. KDPS will update you closer to when they will be distributed.

Changes to Digital device use

From 2027, the Victorian Government is introducing changes to the use of digital devices for students from Prep to Grade 6.

Under the new guidelines, For KDPS, this means:

- Will no longer invite families to purchase or bring their own digital devices to use at school for Prep to Grade 6
- Will follow new recommended digital device times, including minimal device time for Prep to Grade 2; and a maximum of 90 minutes per day for grades 3 to 6.

These changes are intended to support families by reducing cost-of-living pressures. They will also support students by reducing screen-time which can reduce the risk of eye strain, sedentary behaviour, and reduced peer interaction. These reforms complement Victoria's nation-leading mobile phone restrictions, ensuring an integrated approach to addressing digital distraction and the inappropriate use of technology.





Big Life Term 4 Weeks 1 & 2

Last fortnight in Big Life we explored what **resilience** is and ways we can be resilient. Resilience means being able to cope with tough or tricky situations, and finding ways to bounce back. It's about being flexible in how we think, feel and act so we can adjust when things don't go to plan.

WAYS WE CAN HELP
Build Resilience at Home:

1. Notice and celebrate your child's effort, persistence, and problem-solving.
2. Encourage them to "have another go" and remind them of their past successes.
3. Model positive coping strategies like taking a breath, staying calm, and looking for solutions.
4. Talk about mistakes being part of learning, helping us grow and learn.
5. Highlight your child's unique strengths (kindness, curiosity, creativity, humour, etc.) and how they can use these to overcome challenges.
6. Support them to recognise their feelings and choose helpful and safe ways to respond.

Big Life with Mel

On Friday of week 2, Mel worked with the Grade 2/3s and the Grade 5/6s. The 2/3 classes learned about three levels of **respect**: Self respect, respect for others & respect for our school. The Grade 5/6s discussed **transition to high school** and strategies that help us when we are preparing for big changes. Students practiced reading a high school timetable and map and shared what they are looking forward to in 2026.

Children still need active supervision near roads until 11-12 years old.

This is a key responsibility of parents, carers and adults.



Children learn about pedestrian/road safety by modelling safe behaviour.

They learn from you! It's up to you to be a great role model and set the right example.

Driveways are a risk. Always double check before reversing or moving the car.

Young children in particular are at risk, as they are small and hard to detect from the vehicle.

Talk and practice road safety with your children as you are outside near roads.


Children learn best when they are practicing their skills in real time.

FAQ'S

Do I need to register?

No you don't need to register to use the Community Cupboards.

Do I need to pay?

No you don't need to pay for anything. Anything inside the Community Cupboard is free.

Are the Community Cupboards only for CFA members?

No, the Community Cupboards are for all the community. You don't need to be a CFA member to use the Community Cupboards.

Why are they located at Fire Stations?

We need safe locations around Moyne Shire with lighting and the CFA kindly said we could install the Community Cupboards on their sites.

What is in the Community Cupboards?

The contents of the Community Cupboards may change slightly week to week but common items include:
